

Service of Table: The Season of Lent

Word of Invitation:

We are one family in the love and grace of Christ. Today, we are invited to the feast of joy and salvation provided by Our Saviour.

God, who created heaven and earth, created us in the image of God's glory. God also willingly came to earth in the form of a vulnerable human being to become a sacrifice of salvation and reconciliation for us. We will come to God's banquet and taste the joy of God's kingdom. We will remember the blessings we have received and the blessings we are called to be. Come to be blessed. Come to be fed. Come, for the Spirit is calling, inviting us to be nourished and born anew.

Let us give thanks and praise to God because God is always with us. All are welcome here.

Call to Give Thanks:

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to God Let us give our thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Thanksgiving:

Thanks and praise be to you, O God, for you create life out of the dust, and sustain us even in the desert. We thank you that in the face of every temptation and trial, every principality and power, you are present to direct and guide, to renew and revive.

We praise you for sending us Jesus, your Suffering Servant, to walk before us the way of the cross, to turn us to you and to one another.

The Institution of the Lord's Supper:

On the night in which he surrendered himself, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to the disciples, saying: "Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Each time you do this, remember me."

When the meal had ended, Jesus took the cup, offered thanks, and gave it to the disciples, saying:

"Drink. This cup is the promise of God, made in my blood. Each time you drink from this cup, remember me."

Affirmation of Memory and Hope:

Loving God, we rejoice in the gift of your grace, remembering Christ's life and death, proclaiming his resurrection, waiting in hope for his coming again. Grant that, in praise and thanksgiving, we may so offer ourselves to you that our lives may proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Prayer for Transformation:

Send, O God, your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts, that all who share in this loaf and cup may be the body of Christ: light, life, and love in the world.
